Overview of School

Huntington High School is a four-year high school located in Huntington, West Virginia. It was established in 1996 through the consolidation of the old Huntington and Huntington East High Schools. With a student body of approximately 1700, Huntington High School is dedicated to quality education for all students and committed to developing lifelong learners who value themselves and others, contribute to their community, and achieve individual success in an ever-changing world.

Academic Program

Twenty-four credits are required for the Class of 2014.

Advanced Placement/Honors

Advanced Placement courses are offered in English, Math, Science, Foreign Language, Social Studies, Art, and Computer Science, based on student request. We are constantly striving to increase the rigor of our school, and are pleased to show how we have increased our AP courses from 8 courses offered in 2009 to currently having 17 AP courses in our curriculum. Along with the 17 AP Courses we offer 30 Honors courses.

Accreditation

Huntington High School was opened in 1996 and is chartered by the West Virginia Department of Education. Class periods are 50 minutes, five times per week, thirty-six weeks per year. Huntington High School operates on a two-semester calendar year.

Placement

In all academic areas the students are placed according to their ability into Honors, Advanced, and General classes.
